on Block Island for which we offer a number of racing events including the Thursday Night Sailing Series, the Mary D Fund Benefit Regatta, the BICS Offshore Regatta, and the BICS Around the Island Pursuit Regatta. BICS is the only sailing organization on Block Island to run regattas with US Sailing Certified Race officials and we provide all the regatta promotion, race management, and scoring and after race parties needed to run a well-managed event. A brief description of each of our comprehensive sailing program activities follows:

2024 Keelboat Sailing Lessons

BICS offers the nationally accredited US Sailing "Basic Keelboat" sailing instruction curriculum, with beginner lessons scheduled at 9:00 and intermediate lessons scheduled at noon, every weekday, sailing out of the New Harbor Boat Basin. Our US Sailing Certified Sailing instructors have introduced over a hundred adults and their families to the joy of sailing in our Raven 24 sail training vessels, leading to sailing proficiency certification. Special mention this year to Bill Brakefield and Lisa Myette, and also to Amanda Leaseburge and Tyler Sarlie for achieving their Beginner Sailing Proficiency Certificates. 2024 Thursday Night Sail Racing Series

This event is a 10 weeklong sail racing series in which the Island's most accomplished sailors face off against each other in around-the-buoys racing every Thursday evening. This event is specifically for keel boats, in an advanced racing clinic, with coaching and a weekly newsletter on the Racing Rules of Sailing, boat speed techniques, and racing tactics. The racing format is typically a windward-leeward course set in the recreational area in the northern section of the Great Salt Pond. The courses are typically about a mile and a half, or twenty minutes long, which allows three races to be run each evening. The Race Committee was run by BICS Director Henry duPont, who was assisted by BICS members, Elizabeth Moss, and John and Kathi O 'Reardon. Each of the Race Committee members participated in setting the racecourse, timing the starts and finishes, and recording the scores for each race.

The Thursday Night Sailing Series 1st Place finish was awarded to Bob Closter sailing his J/24 "Island Spirit. Second place honors went to co-skippers George Davis and Todd Crouch sailing a Colgate 26 "Slapshot", and 3rd place went Joe Harris, Dr Tom Warcup, and Russ Certo sailing BICS's own Olympic Class Soling "Oh Behave!".

Mary D Fund Benefit Regatta

Block Island's historic Mary D Fund Benefit Regatta, a popular fundraising event in the 1990s, was sailed yet again on Saturday July 15th in Block Island Sound. Five boats entered the regatta which was hosted by Block Island Community Sailing. The course this year was windwardleeward, 13 miles in length, from the start/finish line set just north of the Great Salt Pond entrance channel up to the "R6" Bell buoy off of Coonymous Point, and back downwind to finish at "1 BI" the North Point Buoy.. Race conditions had Southely winds between 5 and 8 knots. Henry duPont, served as the Regata Organizer and on-the-water Race Committee Official. The race conditions were challanging because of the current at the "R6" windward mark in light air. Mercifully the wind filled in on the way back to the finish line.

BICS Offshore Regatta

Our Offshore Regatta, which was held August 10th, is a mid-distance yacht race sailed around

government marks in Block Island Sound. This regatta is on the Eastern Connecticut Sailing Association's Offshore Racing Circuit Calendar as a "points" race. four boats entered the regatta, which was hosted by Block Island Community Sailing. The course this year was a windward- leeward-windward course, 6.8 miles in length, from the start/finish line set about 200 yards north of the entrance channel up to the "R6" buoy off of Cooneymous Cove, and back to the start/finish line. Race conditions had Southerly winds between 6 and 10 knots. The Race Officials consisted of Regatta Chair, Henry duPont who organized and scored the event and on the water Race Committee members, John and Kathi O'Reardon.



Light air and some signififant current made the racing conditions chalanging with regard to which side of the course was most favorable, but Chuck Townsend, sailing his Lyman-Morse E33

led the way and took a commanding lead to the windward mark followed by Jeremy Moore sailing his C&C 29, Steve Wadsworth sailing his J/99, and Tom Merritt sailing BICS's own Cape Dory 28. On the leg home to the finish line, "Mischief" under her large spinnaker made up some time and caught the two spinniker class yachts (on corrected time) which rounded the windward mark ahead of her.

Top honors in the Cruising Class go to Chuck Townsend sailing "Nimble" a Lyman-Morse E33 who also got line honors finishing 13 minutes before the next racing yacht.

Top honors in the Spinnaker Class go to Tom Merritt sailing "Mischief" BICS's own Cape Dory 28, who beat Jeremy Moore's C&C 29 "Perservetence" in second place by less than a minute of corrreted time. Jeremy was was followed by Steve Wadworth's J/99 "Tripple Wiskey" in third. This regatta was followed by an after-race awards party graciously hosted by Becky Pappas and Tim Clark in their party tent at the Beachead Restaurant.

2024 BICS Around the Island Pursuit Race

On Sunday, Sept 1st, BICS hosted the 12th annual Around the Island Pursuit Race. This Regatta sanctioned by the Eastern Connecticut Sailing Association as a "points" regatta on their Offshore Racing Circuit. This year the regatta had 8 yachts competing, with 2 from the mainland, including the largest yacht ever to register for this event, "Carthage Must be Destroyed", a very impressive looking Farr 53 racer / cruiser from NY, NY. The race conditions featured SSW winds from 7-10 knots at the start and freshining to 18 knots at the finish. The regatta featured

a 17 mile course sailed around the Island in a counter clockwise direction with the start / finish line set just outside of the New Harbor entrance channel.

The winning yacht in the Spinnaker Class was "Screwball", an Aerodyne 38 co-skippered by Keven and Amy Carse, from Clinton CT. Second place went to "Island Spirit" a J/24 skippered by Bob Closter from Block Island, and third place went to "Carthage Must Be Destroyed" who started last and passed everyone except the two top finishers.

The winning yacht in the Cruising Class was the lovely Alerion Express "Simplicity", sailed by Jim Fiorato Bill Cumby, and Ed Herran of Block Island

"RUSH" finished 10th out of 29 boats who raced in Division 1 of the Eastern Connecticut Sailing Association's offshore racing circuit.

BI Community Sailing's own Cape Dory 28 "Mischief" sailed in the Stonington Harbor Yacht Club B.I.G. Jack Regatta sailed from Watch Hill to the New Harbor entrance with Roy Fowler as Skipper and Alan Skinner and Henry duPont as crew. "Mischief" sailed well getting 4th place out of 12 racing yachts. "Mischief also sailed in Newport Yacht Club's Cliff Mitchel Regatta racing from Newport to Block Island on Saturday October 11th. Mischief was crewed by Tom Merritt, Alan Skinner, and Henry duPont who delivered the boat to Newport, attended the Skippers meeting at the Newport Yacht Club, had a pleasant dinner in town, spent the night on the boat, and after a 9:00 start, raced to Block Island.
